Resolution 9807-04

- PASC SEC Authorizes a Study Group with open membership to initiate a joint revision of ISO/IEC 9945-1, ISO/IEC 9945-2, IEEE Std 1003.1, IEEE Std 1003.2, and the appropriate parts of The Open Group Single UNIX Specification. The revision should result in a common standard or standards, which must be completed within the next 3 to 5 years.
