

Joe W. Carter Biography

Mr. Joe W. Carter is currently the Deputy G6 of the Program Executive Office (PEO) Chief Information Officer (CIO) / G6 office. He is the chair for the Army's Real Time, Safety Critical, Embedded (RTSCE) Computing Environment (CE) Working Group (WG), which consists of over 40 programs across 8 PEOs, which is part of the U.S. Army's Common Operating Environment (COE). PEO Aviation's aircraft including rotary, fixed wing and unmanned systems are adopting the Future Airborne Capability Environment (FACE) to meet the COE standards and architecture. FACE is one of the Real Time Interoperability Framework (RTIF) enablers that the RTSCE CEWG has adopted for its member systems to meet COE compliance. He has the responsibility for assisting the tactical systems to achieve Army Interoperability Certification (AIC) via COE and other interoperability testing. His PEO Aviation team has the responsibility for Information Assurance (IA) of tactical systems. This team assists PEO AVN systems in meeting IA standards to receive an Authority to Operate (ATO) and a Certificate of Networkiness (CoN).

During his off times, Joe is a football official; officiating from the middle school to the semi-professional level. He also enjoys woodworking and fishing.

Prior to coming to the Government, Joe worked at a number of organizations with responsibilities ranging from programmer, team lead, software manager and project manager.
